The dinning room had a nice view of the bay, and we even saw the Alma sailing by.

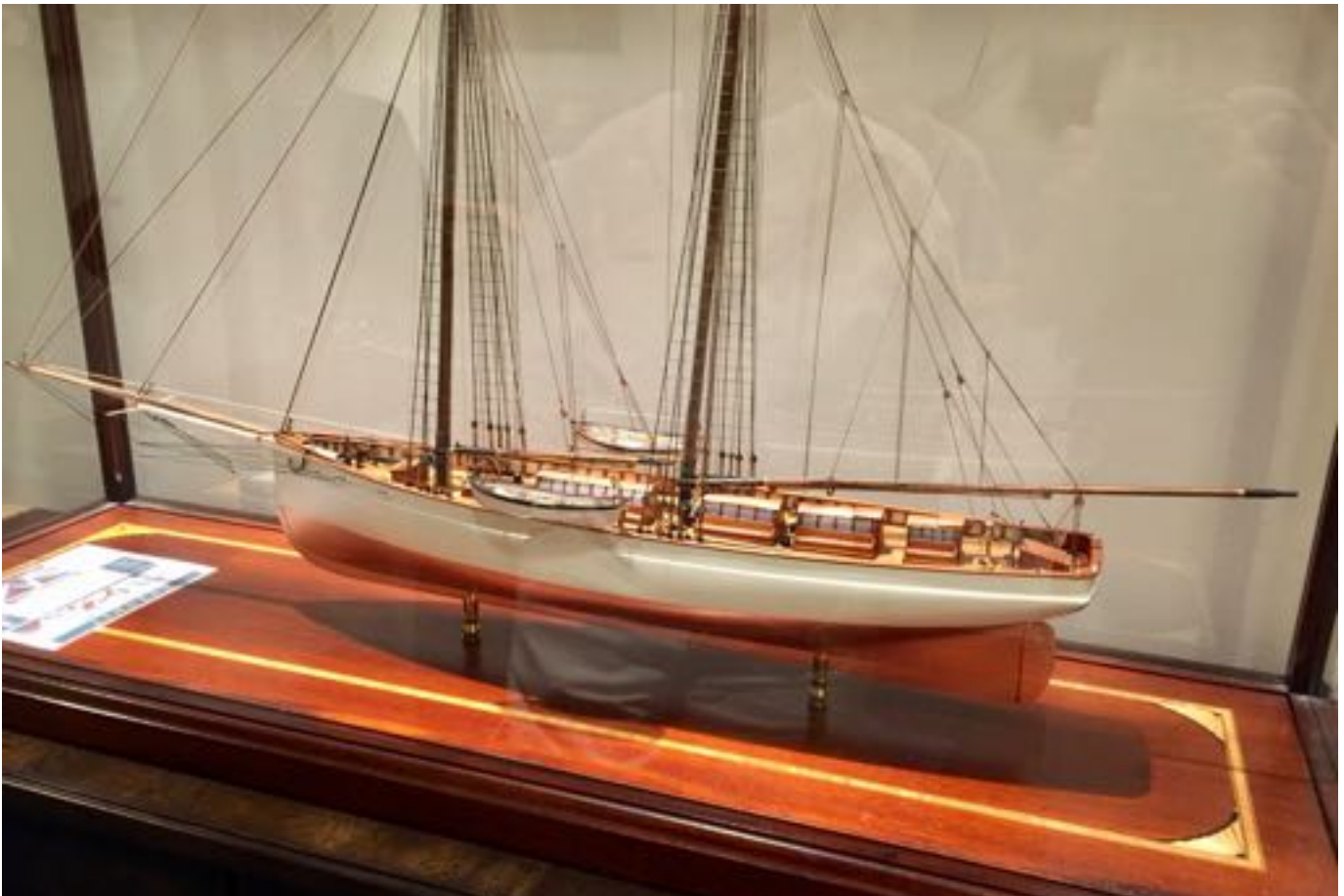

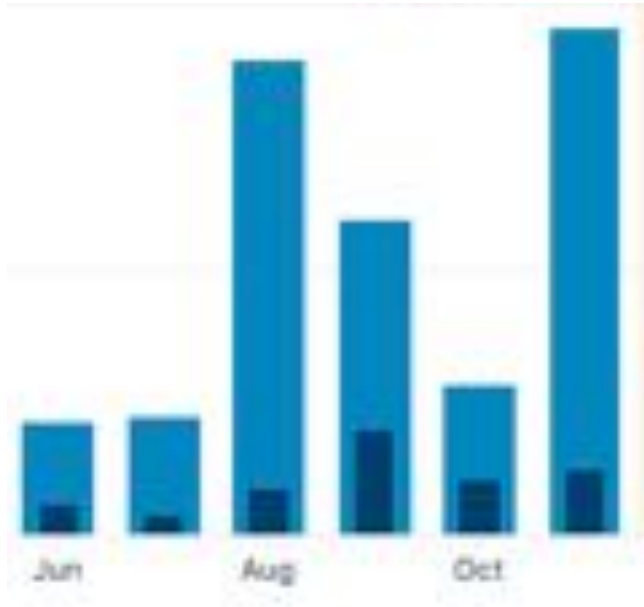
Treasurer's Report

Here's a graph of website visits over the past several months to give you an idea of the relative change in visits over time.



The last column is November. The dark portion shows the number of visitors, the light portion shows the total amount of activity on the site. The graph shows that while November visits is lower than our all time high in September, the visitors on our site have spent more time viewing the contents of our site. So, clearly, we're posting stuff that people are interested in.

There was plenty to talk about around the meeting table, and we had a couple books showing that we passed around the table.

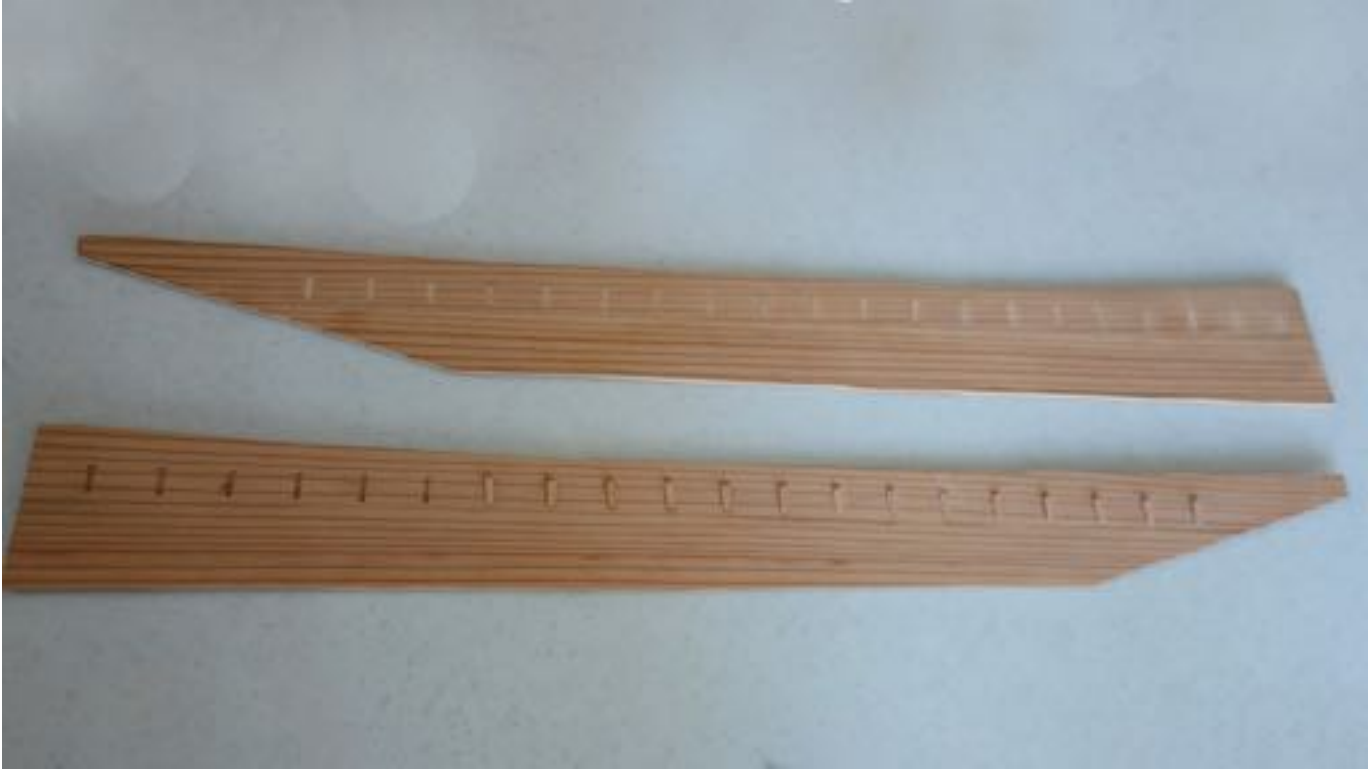

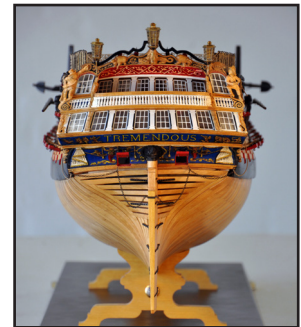
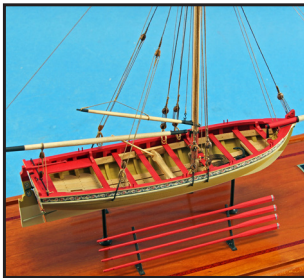
